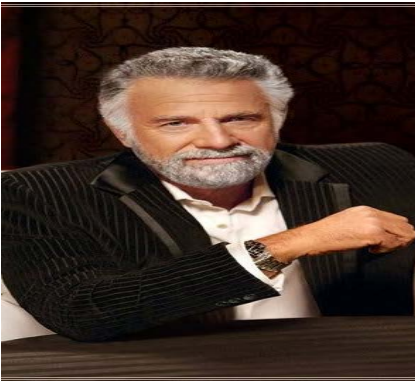

"The food here is really good," said Nick Leonard (Bradley), with a satisfying smile of satisfaction on his face.

Breakfast begins by offering us an assortment of deliciously healthy and unhealthy foods. The main dishes include; waffles, hash browned potatoes, sausage patties, hard-cooked eggs, grits, and scrambled eggs. "All the potato products thus far have been delicious," said Chris Bell (Bradley). Though a 4 oz serving of hash browned potatoes clocks in at 150 calories, they still serve as excellent energy for our daily activities. 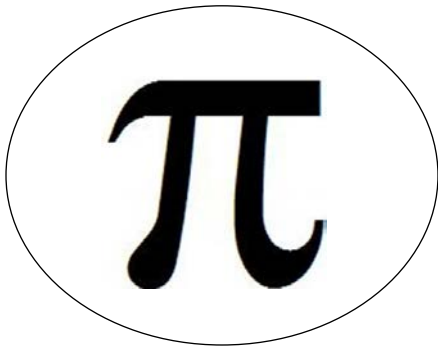
