Review and Hightlights: The Admiral

Yesterday marked the day of the first convention of the seventy-fourth annual Boys State of Virginia, and as in many years past, the delegates were graced with inspiring words from Rear Admiral William Cobb, a veteran of the United States Navy. Rear Admiral Cobb was a graduate of the United States Naval Academy and later the Executive Officer aboard the USS Jouett, where he was widely acclaimed as an inspiration to his crew and a model for other officers to strive for. Cobb, who retired from active duty in the year 2003, offered warm words of encouragement to this year's delegates, as well as entertaining the group

with answers to thought-provoking questions from the audience.

Admiral Cobb's jovial demeanor in no way diluted the critical nature of his advice, his heartfelt statements evoking both silent contemplation and roaring applause from his audience. His powerful guidance was interspersed with just enough light humor to engage the delegates and elicit laughter, the reverence the aspiring leaders had for him truly eminent. The respect they held for the speaker was later echoed in their thoughtful questions, addressed directly to their esteemed guest.

These queries ranged from requests for anecdotes about his career to advice that would help the

delegates in their future endeavors. Cobb was asked about the nature of leadership and how to succeed in command, responding that delegates ought to "lead by example." When one delegate wanted to know what the most important trait for a leader to have is, he replied that humility is key. "Keep your mouth shut and listen," he said with a smile, right after one delegate asked how to advance in life. It was responses like these which inspired both chuckles and insight from Cobb's listeners.

The Admiral proved an extremely valuable advisor for the participants at Boys State, the lengthy lines formed by those eager to speak with

him a testament to his outstanding character. By the end of his address, the memory of Admiral Cobb's words would be forever cemented in the minds of the Boys State delegates. Without a doubt, next year's speech will be equally resonant.
